The mission of the Wisconsin Lions Foundation, Inc. is to provide a vehicle for the Lions, Lioness, and Leo Clubs to work together toward a common cause, a vision, or a project while serving the residents of Wisconsin.



Foundation Overview

The Wisconsin Lions Foundation was initiated at the 1955 State Convention in Stevens Point and was formally organized at the 1956 State Convention in Fond du Lac. It is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, sponsored by the Lions of Wisconsin, for charitable, benevolent, and educational purposes.

From its humble beginning, the Foundation has grown to be the pride and joy of the Lions, Lioness, and Leos of Wisconsin. It is also the envy of the Lions throughout the Country and very much appreciated by the people whose lives have been, or are being, changed by its programs. Through the efforts of the individual Clubs throughout Wisconsin, public donations, memorials, Birch-Sturm Fellowships, and bequests, the Foundation's assets have grown to over \$5,000,000. This is all made possible because Clubs and individuals believe in what the Foundation has to offer and because of the watchful administration of the Board of Directors.

The Foundation is subject to the direction of the Lions of Wisconsin through convention action. Each Lion in Wisconsin is an equal shareholder of the Foundation and has a right to cast their vote at the Annual Meeting taking place at the State Convention. The Foundation's continued success is dependent upon the involvement and direction given by its shareholders.

Membership on the Board of Directors is composed of two Directors elected from each District. These Directors are elected at their District Conventions. In addition, one of the current District Governors also serves as a Board of Directors Member and as a liaison between the Council of Governors and the Foundation Board of Directors. The Board of Directors elects their own officers, and the President appoints the Committee Chairmen and assigns members to the various committees.

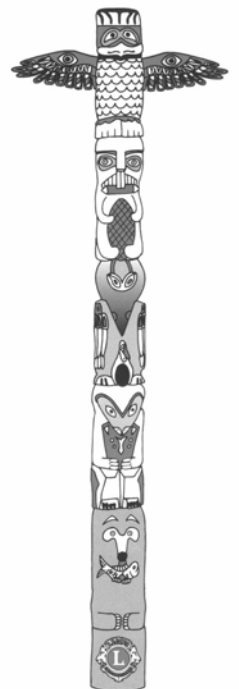

Camp Property

The Recreation Shelter bathrooms were finished approximately one week prior to Lions Day, 2003, along with the walkway to Indian Hollow.

A new electrical service panel was installed under a shelter by the Camp entrance. Adjacent to that is another shelter with a 3-dimensional sign of the Camp property.

The Pinewood Lodge roof was replaced with all necessary venting to insure free circulation of air in the attic area. Duplexes #4, 5, and 6 were refurbished inside. There were 36 wardrobe doors for Pinewood Lodge built and installed by the staff; seal coated and given two coats of varnish by St. Peter's Lions Club. THANKS to all!

In December, the Kitchen/Dining Hall Renovation was completed with bathrooms, a separate meeting/dining room, and a more spacious working environment in the new kitchen. A big THANK YOU to the main donor and anyone else who donated to the project.

The trail groomer at camp was completely overhauled. Special THANKS go to the East Troy Lions Club.

The rope courses have been repaired to get ready for summer camp.

The Nature Center roof has been pulled back together and made ready for roof repairs and new shingles.

The bathrooms in the Memorial Building and the WLF Board room have been refurbished.

A new electrical service has been installed in the Health Lodge.

The underground electrical service to duplexes 5 & 6 was replaced, along with a new electrical service to the Nature Center and speaker wires to Indian Hollow and the Nature Center.

Sight

The Sight Committee continues to be an area of major focus with your Wisconsin Lions Foundation, Inc. The following is an update of activities that have taken place through April 30, 2004:

Eyeglass Recycling Center

Thanks to the donations of Lions, Lioness and Leo clubs, in addition to concerned individuals, we have collected over **649,858** pairs of used eyeglasses so far this year. We have approximately **592,671** pairs that are waiting to be sorted. Year-to-date, we have shipped **70,850** pairs of eyeglasses to needy missions in developing countries worldwide and have **76,745** pairs available for shipment.



The Center is always in need of help to clean, sort, and read the glasses. This can be done at the Center or at one of the many satellite stations. The Center processes nearly one million pairs of eyeglasses a year with the help of Columbia County Correctional Facility and the many satellite stations.

The Sight Committee continues to promote the use of certificates for eyeglass collection locations.

Second Sight

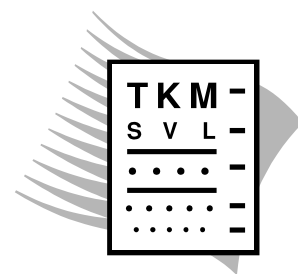


A coordinated effort is underway in District 27-D1, along with the Madison Rotary Club, to collect used eyeglasses during the month of May 2004. Past efforts netted over 20,000 pairs of eyeglasses.

Children's Vision Screening

In conjunction with Prevent Blindness Wisconsin®, we conducted Vision Screening training in these districts for 2003-2004:

- Ø B2—Completed in September and re-certified in November
- Ø E1—Completed in January and March



We have scheduled Vision Screening training sessions for 2004-2005 in these districts:

- Ø A2—April 17
- Ø B1 & D1—We will conduct photo screening training in May
- Ø B2—Training will be scheduled
- Ø D2, E2, C1—Training sessions will be held in spring 2005

Lions and Lioness Clubs are trained in standard vision screening or photo screening, with more clubs becoming active every year.

Community Diabetes Education Project

A Diabetes Symposium was held at your Wisconsin Lions Camp on April 17, 2004.

- Ø The purpose was to educate and organize for maximum effectiveness in combating Diabetes in MD27.
- Ø District diabetes chairpersons, District Governors, Vice District Governors, and Affiliate District Presidents were in attendance for this important event.
- Ø 50-minute seminars were conducted by representatives of the American Diabetes Association and the Wisconsin Department of Health.



The Sight Committee has established a good working relationship with the American Diabetes Association and Prevent Blindness, as well as District chairpersons, and will stay active to make sure our mission is accomplished.

Girl Scouts



Our partnership with the Girl Scouts in District 27-A1 has led to the collection of a number of used eyeglasses as this past year. We will continue to put effort forth to grow this project in future years.

Hearing

The Hearing Program's objectives are to financially support and promote the statewide programs for the prevention of hearing loss and to aid those individuals with hearing impairment. It consists of the Hearing Aid Program and the Hearing Dog Program.

Hearing Aid Program

The purpose of the Hearing Aid Program is to provide aids for residents of Wisconsin with impaired hearing who cannot afford them. Through a joint effort and the generosity of the Lions, Lioness, and Leo Clubs of Wisconsin, along with hearing professionals and hearing aid manufacturers—many individuals have improved their quality of life. The applicant establishes a need for a hearing aid and completes an application for financial assistance by contacting the Wisconsin Lions Foundation. Income levels are verified by the District Hearing chair. Once the application is approved, the applicant is referred to an audiologist in his/her area. A hearing aid is ordered and the recipient meets with the audiologist for the fitting and dispensing of the aid. Who pays for the hearing aid? The hearing aid manufacturer provides a generous discount towards the purchase of the hearing aid, and the WLF pays up to \$250 towards that new hearing aid. The WLF receives salvage value from a hearing aid manufacturer from used hearing aids that are collected by Lions, Lioness, & Leos and turned in to the WLF. The salvage value of used aids does not pay for all the new aids requested. Clubs, individuals, and districts donate to the WLF Hearing Fund, to supplement the money that has to come out of the WLF general operating budget to make up the difference. The audiologist accepts a discounted audiologist fee. The ten Lions Districts from around the State collect funds from their respective



local clubs to pay for those audiologist fees within their district. Overall, it is a true team effort to improve the quality of life for individuals who cannot afford hearing aids.

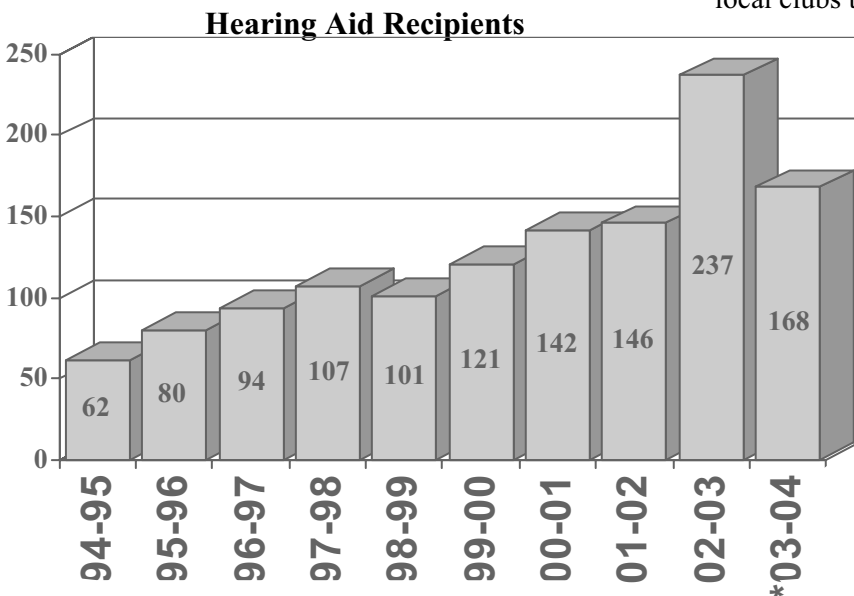
Enhancements of the Hearing Program

-Because the requests for hearing aids by qualified applicants continue to grow, the WLF and the Hearing Committee added "Adopt-a-Hearing Aid" to the Wish List. Individuals, clubs, and districts can Adopt-an-Aid by contributing \$250 to the WLF Hearing Fund and pay for the hearing aid portion of the cost of an aid.

Ways your Club can help:

-**Collection of used hearing aids.** There are many more used hearing aids out there that can be collected for their salvage value. They can be collected with used eyeglasses; and small recycling containers are also available just for hearing aids.

-**Adopt-a-Hearing Aid.** Help us meet the growing need for funds due to increased requests for new hearing aids by Adopting-A-Hearing Aid.

Hearing Dog Program

The WLF Hearing Dog Program has no affiliation with any one hearing dog training facility. However, to be fiscally responsible to the recipient & the Wisconsin Lions, Lioness, & Leos, we prioritize use of hearing dog providers based upon costs and availability. We would generally first use hearing dog providers that do not charge the recipient a fee.

Youth

Terry Peters, Chairperson

The Youth Committee was formed during the 1998-1999 year and has continually grown in its activities. The following is an update of this year's activities.



Leo Fun/Work Day

This is a combination of a partial work day, and Leo activity day. It took place May 7th and 8th. There were 75 Leos staying over Friday night, with 113 Leos and chaperones participating in Saturday's activities.



Youth Exchange

The Foundation helps promote this multi-cultural exchange experience for youth from other countries. Last year, we had 66 young people from 22 countries attend the Youth Exchange Camp in Dundee, along with 20 counselors. This year, we have 20 youth from Wisconsin that will be going to other countries.



Youth Service Project Award

This award is presented to recognize a service project that is carried out by a school or youth group or individual. It is hoped young people will learn the value of doing service for others and learn to appreciate our motto "We Serve" by participating at a young age.

First, Second, and Third Place State winners are chosen from the District First Place winners.

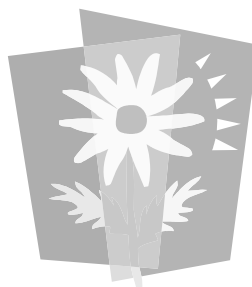


Lions Quest

Resource Development

Glenn Hauge, Chairperson

The main goal of the Resource Development Committee is to provide dollars from new and existing Programs for the Wisconsin Lions Foundation and its projects. To understand Resource Development, you need a primer in Resource Development (RD) 101. Projects refer to the six Statewide Projects we are assigned to run by the Council of Governors. Examples of Projects include Lions Camp, Eyeglass Recycling, etc. Programs are developed by the RD Committee to help fund the Projects. Examples of Programs are listed below.

Participation in the following Programs is to be over and above a Club's Annual Donation.

Deer Hide Collection: This is a program that was started in District 27-C1, by Lion Bernie Stuttgen, PDG, and now has expanded to other areas of the State. WLF received over \$32,000 from the collection of hides last November.

Friends and Honors Garden: The Friends and Honors Garden recognizes donors to the Foundation for \$2,500 and \$5,000 contributions. Donations are accepted from individuals, clubs, and businesses who wish to honor, appreciate, or memorialize someone or something.

The donor's name is permanently inscribed in a 12 x 12 Diamond or half Diamond on one of the six 6x10 granite-clad walls in the garden. Donors have the opportunity to designate how their money is to be used. Wish List items and in-kind donations qualify the donor for recognition, as long as the minimums are reached.

Birch-Sturm Fellowship: The Fellowship is named after Wisconsin's only International Presidents, Frank V. Birch and Clarence L. Sturm. It is a way for districts, clubs, or individuals to honor a person who displays dedication and commitment to Lionism. To become a Birch-Sturm Fellow, a \$1,000 donation must be made to the Wisconsin Lions Foundation. The \$1,000 may be made in one payment or in installments. All revenue received from the Birch-Sturm Fellowship Program is placed into the Endowment Fund. Currently, only investment income earned from the Fund is used to cover the operating expenses of the Foundation.

Wall of Honor: The Committee has created a Wall of Honor to recognize clubs, members, loved ones, and businesses for their support of Wisconsin Lionism. The Wall of Honor is located in the Foundation Administration Building and holds approximately 1,000 solid oak blocks. The blocks are 2 x 6 x 3/4 thick and are laser engraved with the donor's name. Each block sells for just \$500, and when all are sold, will have generated \$500,000 to the ongoing Building Fund. The purchase of a block can be in one check for \$500 or spread over two years for \$250 per year. The Building Fund monies are used for the repair and maintenance of existing buildings, furnishings within the buildings, and new construction as needed.

Sustaining Membership Program:

The RD Committee has developed a Sustaining Membership Program as a way to recognize ongoing supporters. The Committee has worked very hard to keep it affordable for all Wisconsin Lions and Lioness to participate.

Levels of Membership include:

- Ø **Bronze:** A donation of just \$50. In addition to the title, the member receives a red-trimmed lapel pin and a membership card entitling them to a 10% discount on purchases at the Trading Post for a period of one year.
- Ø **Silver:** A donation of \$100. The member receives a blue-trimmed lapel pin and a membership card entitling them to a 15% discount on purchases at the Trading Post for a period of one year.
- Ø **Gold:** Reserved for those who have been Silver Sustaining Members for five consecutive years or who give a total donation of \$500 all at once. The member receives a special Gold Sustaining Membership lapel pin, an exclusive registration number, a plaque with their name and exclusive number engraved on it, a membership card entitling them to a 15% discount on purchases at the Trading Post for a period of five years, and a special meal and program held in their honor at Lions Camp.

Monies generated from this Program are used for general operating expenses, including Lions Camp.

Stock Car Races:

The Committee has entered into an agreement with Bo Bavery, an up and coming driver who is donating a portion of his winnings and sponsorships to WLF to help offset the expense of the Camp for Children with diabetes. This effort is called Driving Down Diabetes.

Sports Raffle:

The RD Committee hopes to implement a Statewide Sports Raffle where there would be hundreds of sporting event tickets— all the way from Packer Games to small college events— that would be raffled off. Tickets would sell for \$5.00 each or three for \$10.00. Clubs who participate by selling tickets would be allowed to keep half of the proceeds. Local taverns and Miller Brewery have expressed interest in helping with this effort.

Public Relations

The Public Relations Committee is responsible for informing Lions, Lioness, Leos, and members of our local communities about the programs and projects of the Wisconsin Lions Foundation (WLF). Many changes have recently been made at the Foundation and Lions Camp, and we encourage everyone to make visiting “your” Lions Camp a priority.

Camp Orientation Sign – This past year, a large 4 x 8 wooden orientation sign/map was erected at the entrance of Lions Camp. This map shows the location of various buildings, activity areas, trails, the lake, and other points of interest. The map gives visitors a good idea of the camp layout and vastness of the Foundation property.

Wisconsin State Fair – Once again, the New Berlin Lions provided space at their fair stand to promote WLF, Lions Camp, and Lionism in general. It is most interesting to spread the word of our Lions Camp and the projects of Wisconsin Lions. Many positive comments were received from people attending the fair. If you are interested in joining us at the 2004 State Fair, contact your WLF Director or the Foundation Office. A “big thank you” to the New Berlin Lions.

Lions Camp Open House (Lions Day) July 18, 2004 – This is the new title given to the former “Lions Day.” The day is designed to invite Lions, Lioness, Leos, prospective Lions, and individuals from your local communities to visit your Lions Camp. The Lions of Wisconsin are very proud of their camp, and this is a great way to invite everyone to see the camp in action and learn about other projects of WLF. Spread the word in your clubs and local communities.



The Public Relations Committee encourages all Lions, Lioness, and Leos to keep the public informed about the programs and services they provide to their local communities. Don't be afraid to toot your own horn!

My personal thank you to the WLF Directors, Lioness Representatives, and the Council Representative who served as members of the Public Relations Committee. Their insight and direction is greatly appreciated.

Dear Members:

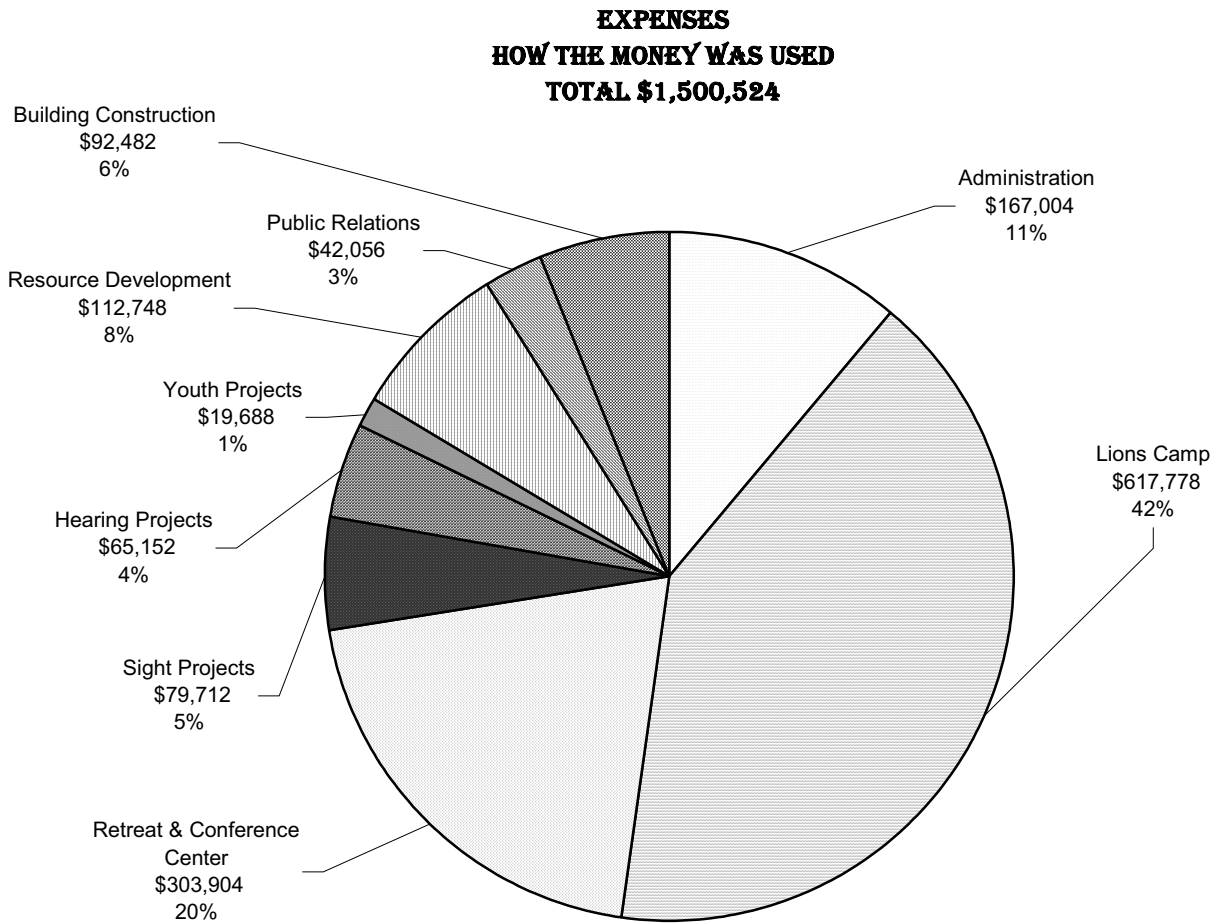
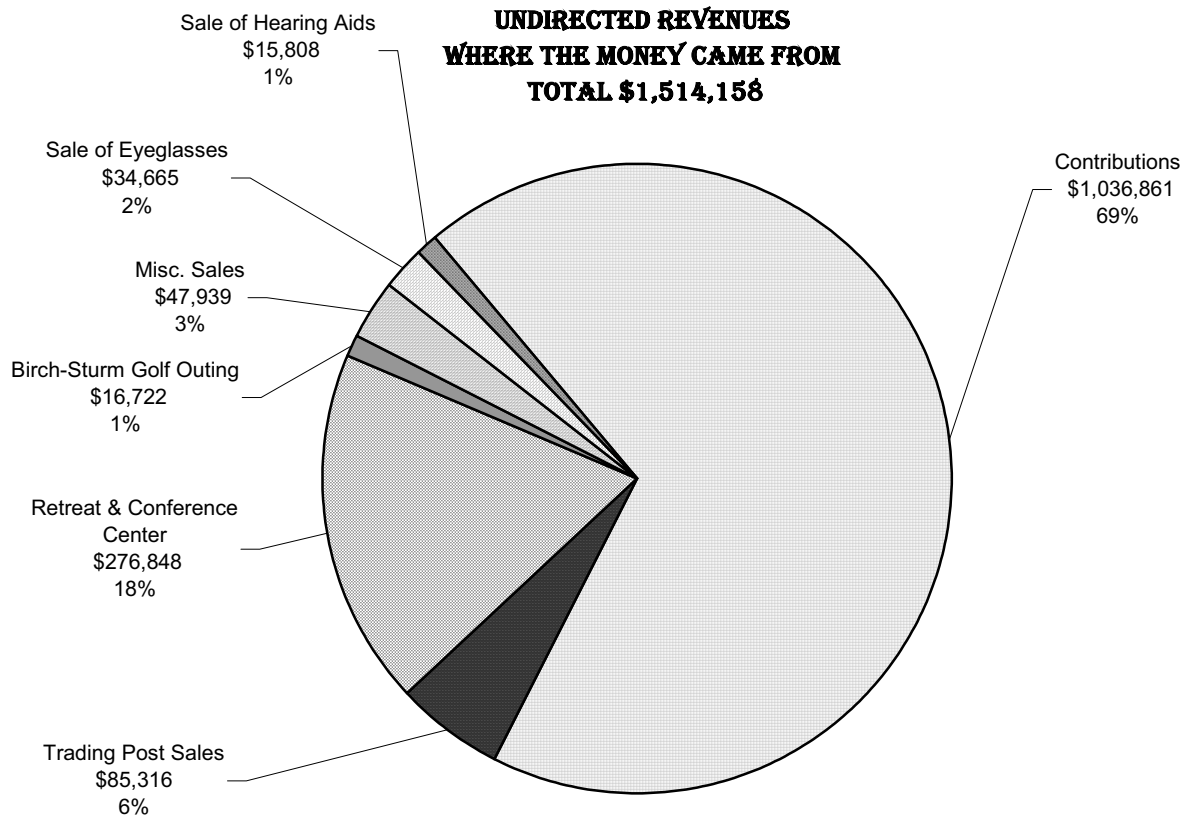

Funding for the Foundation

Your Wisconsin Lions Foundation is directed by the Council of Governors to run the Statewide Projects to benefit your Club and the people of your community. Your Foundation is funded by Annual Donations and the Programs those members participate in on a voluntary basis. Please continue your support and participation in WLF's Programs.



Undirected and Directed Donations

Donations are broken down into two categories: Undirected and Directed

Undirected Donations:

- ∅ Undirected Donations come from Lions, Lioness, and Leo Clubs to help pay for the operation of WLF, including the local projects offered to Clubs and their communities. (Lions Camp is an example of these Projects.)
- ∅ Clubs' Annual Donations are the biggest source of Undirected Donations.
- ∅ Annual Donations are used for operational expenses without restriction.
- ∅ Money from the Sustaining Membership program is also used for operational expenses.
- ∅ Friends and Honors Garden donations may be directed to operational expenses by the donor.

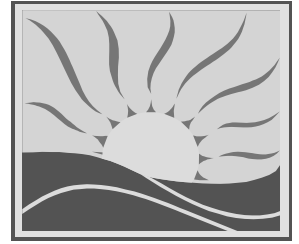
Directed Donations:

- ∅ Directed Donations can come from anyone, but have a specific project or cause that they must be used for.
- ∅ A single Directed Donation can be split among several different projects, but this is always decided by the donor.
- ∅ Some examples of Directed Donations include:
 - a. **Birch-Sturm Fellowship** – Money must go into the Endowment Fund.
 - b. **Wall of Honor** – Money must go into the Building Fund.
 - c. **Wish List** – Money is used to purchase selected items only.
 - d. **Memorials** – Money must go into the Endowment Fund.
 - e. **Friends and Honors Garden** – Money is used as the donor wishes. It can be Directed (Building Fund, Hearing, Etc.), or Undirected, and used for operational expenses.

This committee is comprised of all past Directors, (except the current President and Vice-President) and provides direction for the future of the Foundation and the projects assigned to it. The committee continues to explore the possibility of obtaining a celebrity spokesperson to promote the Foundation through Public Service Announcements.



The committee has proposed the examination of the Adopt-A-Cabin concept—a concept that would allow individuals, clubs, zones, regions, or districts to be responsible for the performance and payment of maintenance duties for the various buildings around the property. This concept is now being examined by the Property Committee. Another area of great concern by the Long Range Planning Committee Members is making the current WLF Directors accountable.

The committee members have established three, five, and ten-year long range plans for the Foundation. They have also established the Past Directors Organization, and this new group, under the very capable leadership of Past Director and PDG, Red Roskopf, is actively looking for ways the Foundation can help improve the service it gives to the Lions, Lioness, and Leos of Wisconsin.
